



Verify Weather Alerts

Small steps. Practical preparation. Keep this page where you can find it.

SET UP RELIABLE INFORMATION

- ☐ Know your local National Weather Service office and emergency-management agency.
- ☐ Enable Wireless Emergency Alerts on a compatible phone; check device settings.
- ☐ Keep a backup weather-information source that works during internet outages.
- ☐ Write official website addresses and radio information in your household plan.

CHECK BEFORE SHARING

- ☐ Check the alert's location, issue time and expiration against an official source.
- ☐ Go directly to the official site instead of trusting a screenshot or forwarded link.
- ☐ Do not delay protective action while debating social posts when an official warning applies.
- ☐ Share the original official alert; correct or remove misleading posts you shared.

SAFETY NOTE A convincing image, familiar logo or large follower count does not prove an alert is genuine. Follow current official local instructions.
